Our Private Security program is doing just thatgiving individuals a career and not just a job. Goodwill Industries of Tulsa has been providing Unarmed Private Security Training on Saturdays since 2006. In today's



society and business climate there has never been such a strong demand for security guards to protect important facilities, equipment, assets and even the people that occupy these areas.

At Goodwill Industries of Tulsa most of the students who desire a career in Private Security can obtain employment in the industry while completing their 8 week course work. Such is the case with Cliffton Manuel. Cliffton began as a student with Private Security training in February of this year. He arrived in Tulsa in 2009 from Texas with his family to obtain a degree in the ministry and to find employment. It was difficult to look for employment because he was not familiar with the city, so he was referred to Goodwill for assistance. He did not take the advice then, but continued to try on his own. It did not work. After working many odd jobs, he soon discovered he needed help and decided to learn more about the programs Goodwill offered.

Cliffton expressed interest in the Private Security training program and met with our Private Security Case manager—Ja Carvalho. In less than 2 months, Cliffton had an interview with G4S Security SEE "A CAREER." PAGE 5

Effective planning takes time and patience. Many people intend to do financial planning at various seasons of life, but few ever accomplish the goal. Planning is the bridge to merge your needs, map your opportunities, and complete your plan.

Through planning you can know that you have provided yourself the best opportunities and the greatest amount of flexibility. You may not know that the planning process does not produce just one single document, but a collaboration of several documents that accomplish specific tasks. Below are a few of the tools that are used in the planning process:

Will - simple legal document expressing a person's desired distribution of their assets

Trust - fiduciary relationship in which one person *(the trustee)* is the holder of the title to property (the trust estate or trust

corpus), subject to an equitable obligation to keep or use the property for the benefit of another (*the beneficiary*)

Advanced Medical Directive (Living Will) - Legal document expressing an individual's last wishes regarding life sustaining treatment

Powers of Attorney - Legal document that authorizes an agent to act on a person's behalf Payable upon Death designation (P.O.D.) - a bank account utilizing a beneficiary designation Transferable upon Death (T.O.D.) - an investment account utilizing a beneficiary designation

Beyond Jobs

oodwill Industries International and the Walmart Foundation launched Beyond Jobs in late 2012 with high expectations.

Beyond Job's mission is to provide women with tools — such as job training and placement and support services — to advance their careers, succeed in the workforce, and meet career and personal goals. The Walmart Foundation provided a \$7.7 million grant to Goodwill Industries International for the program as part of its larger initiative to reach 200,000 disadvantaged women.

Through June, the participating Goodwills have served 4,500 women nationally, and assisted in more than 1,000 becoming employed. Goodwill Industries of Tulsa, through Tulsa *WORKS*, has served 57 women and helped place 21 through June.

"I am amazed by the effect this grant has made on the lives of our Tulsa *WORKS* women," said program director Sabrina Ware. "They have become employed while working on becoming financially fit and they are career minded."

One Beyond Jobs participant said \dots

"TulsaWORKS/Beyond Jobs is certainly one of the best kept job searching secrets in Tulsa!

When I reflect back on the Life Success training, I am in awe of the advantage this one week gave me during my interview process with the University of Oklahoma. Reality is, by following the advice and tips given to me, my confidence level excelled and my interview process was completed in a manner that demonstrated confidence and knowledge.

"Now that I am employed, I wasn't dropped at the employment door step and left to guess at my success. As the title implies TulsaWORKS/Beyond Jobs not only assisted me in becoming employed, but they have gone the extra mile to ensure my future success in continuing to stay employed!"

Goodwill Industries of Tulsa and Tulsa *WORKS* are proud of the early results, but not satisfied. The program expects to help 230 women locally in the two-year grant period. So, the push continues to generate awareness of these services for women in our community.

Recent labor statistics show there is a need. The national unemployment rate for adult women edged up to 6.8 percent in June, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The overall U.S. unemployment rate remained at 7.6 percent. In the Tulsa area, the rate in May was 5.5 percent, up from 4.7 percent in April. Data gleaned from the bureau's "The Employment Situation — June 2013" painted this picture for women:

- The national jobless rate for women had been on a downward trend before the June jump, reaching 6.5 percent (seasonally adjusted) in May. The rate is still below the 7.4 percent rate of a year ago.
- Unemployment numbers also jumped dramatically for African-American women, to 12 percent in June. The rate was 11.6 percent and 11.2 percent in April and May respectively. Unemployment nationally was at 8.6 percent (not seasonally adjusted) in June for Hispanic or Latino women, up from 8.1 percent in May, but down from a year ago (10.3 percent).
- For women maintaining families, the national jobless rate rose in June to 10.7 percent (9.9 percent, May). 1,123,000 of these women were considered unemployed.

Clearly there is a population that could use Beyond Jobs' services. "Improving the lives of working women in Tulsa — what an impact!" Ware said.
