

5 CRUCIAL HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS YOU'RE PROBABLY OVERLOOKING

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The stockings are hung by the chimney with care, and the Christmas tree is safely placed three feet away from the fireplace. OK, that might not be how the old Christmas poem goes. But it's a good tip to keep in mind! Have a disaster-free holiday by practicing these simple (but essential) safety tips.

1. If You Are Traveling

Do not post your travel plans online! Make sure to keep travel plans off your social media networks. Don't post where you are going, when you are leaving, or when you will be back. Sharing that information just makes a thief's job easier. Let a trustworthy neighbor know if you plan to go out of town for the holiday season so they can keep an eye on your house, and have that neighbor grab your mail and newspapers while you are away. And don't hide a key outside the house!

2. Electrical Fires

Before you string lights on your house or trees, inspect the strands for frayed cords or cracked bulbs. Also, do not use indoor lights outside or vice versa. Check the tag on the string of lights if you are unsure.

3. Heating Equipment Fires

Heating equipment such as furnaces and fireplaces can cause house fires if mismanaged. Have a professional inspect your furnace and clean the chimney before you heat your home. Find a professional in your area by searching this keyword phrase: heating and cooling.





4. General Fire Safety

Be safe with small flames and fires this holiday. Don't leave candles unattended, and don't put stockings near a heat source (chimney or fireplace). Install or check smoke alarms, and unplug your Christmas tree during sleeping hours.

5. Grease Fires

Know what to do in case of a grease fire. Take extra precautions with turkey fryers (be sure the oil used to fry the turkey is the right temperature, and always fry outside, in a well-ventilated area.) Don't use water to extinguish a grease fire. Instead, douse the fire with baking soda.

AN FEC STATE OF MIND: STAFF ATTEND ALL-FEC PARTNER CONVENING IN NYC

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In October, the Financial Empowerment Center (FEC) team attended the All-FEC Partner Convening in New York City. Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund hosted the event at Baruch College for two days of learning, networking, and a little fun.

When he participated in a panel discussion, City of Tulsa Mayor G.T. Bynum shared how the FEC fits into Tulsa's goals for building a resilient city. He specifically highlighted our Financial Resilience team's work with Afghan refugee families.



In our group sessions, we explored the FEC's role in promoting racial wealth equity and supporting legacy planning and generational wealth transfer for Black families. We learned about the City of Detroit's work to boost sustainable homeownership and combat foreclosures by adding financial counseling to homeowner tax relief programs.

Our breakout sessions allowed us to discuss with our peers the best ways to build effective partnerships and motivate clients, and the ins and outs of our client management database.

I gained a lot of insights. A key takeaway was that we all had something to offer to the CFE/FEC enterprise, no matter how long we have been in operation. I was part of a panel on counselor retention and professional development, and I shared tips on training and running reports in our manager breakouts. That experience was, well, empowering.

As of November, we are two months into the Year 2 phase of the FEC. Our counselors served 69 clients (25 new) in 79 sessions this month. We have 525 clients with pending appointments and another 170 new referrals, which should enable us to meet our Year 2 target of 200 sessions per month in the future. This month, clients achieved 17 outcomes and 41 achievements (the small steps that lead to outcomes).

Data quality is another focus for Year 2. We instituted a plan with time set aside each week for data checks and to catch up on data entry. This effort also helps us identify issues with reports or database glitches that we relay back to CFE.

Don't forget! The services offered by FEC are available to employees who are Tulsa residents. There is still time to create a holiday spending plan. If you would like a worksheet to help you set one up, then call extension 249.


