CELEBRATING 95 YEARS OF SERVICE

As the rains of May begin to subside and we prepare to move into the warm and dry months of summer, I want to make you aware of a significant event in the history of our organization that will be taking place on August 3rd of 2022. On that day Goodwill Industries of Tulsa will be celebrating our 95th anniversary!

It is easy to get caught up in our day-to-day activities at Goodwill and not fully recognize the significance of this achievement. Goodwill Industries of Tulsa is on a very short list of companies or organizations of any type that have been continuously operating in Tulsa for the last 95 years! With that in mind, I wanted to use my column this month to reflect on some of our history and make you aware of some plans we are working on to recognize this milestone in our organization's history.

In 1927, the Reverend Wilkie Clock, pastor of the West Tulsa Methodist Church, petitioned Goodwill Industries International to open a Goodwill operation in Tulsa. Twelve counties in northeast Oklahoma were split off from the territory of the St. Louis Goodwill and Goodwill Industries of Tulsa was started in the basement of the West Tulsa Methodist Church with our official incorporation date being August 3, 1927.

As Goodwill Industries of Tulsa grew it became necessary to establish a permanent location and volunteers reclaimed bricks from a local refinery that had closed and built a three-story building next door to the church that served as Goodwill's headquarters.

As Goodwill continued to grow in the 1940s it became necessary to move again and we purchased the old Brady Hotel, an eight-story building in downtown Tulsa, to serve as our headquarters. Although it took many years to remodel and adapt this building to serve as a Goodwill headquarters, it served the organization well through the 1960s.

In 1971, Goodwill leadership made the decision to purchase the old Stockton's Discount Center at 2800 Southwest Boulevard, our current home today. This site has been expanded and remodeled several times since it was purchased, with major expansions taking place in 1992 & 2002. As I reflect on this history it always surprises me to think that for over 95 years Goodwill Industries of Tulsa has had three primary locations and they are all located within a 2-mile radius of our original home in the basement of the West Tulsa Methodist Church.



It should make us all proud to reflect back on the innumerable people whose lives have been positively impacted by the decision in 1927 to establish a Goodwill in Tulsa, Oklahoma. But it is also humbling to think about how many people over the years have made a commitment to our mission, because none of this would have been possible without that. I am grateful that we have had the opportunity to stand on the shoulders of our predecessors and continue the great work that they started almost a century ago.

We will celebrate Goodwill Industries of Tulsa's 95th anniversary in a couple of meaningful ways this summer. One way is by hosting a party for employees at the 2800 campus in late July/August. And, we will have a "party in a box" for each of our other locations—nobody will miss out on the fun! Keep an eye out for more information. Also, we are going to use social media and other channels to make sure our community is aware of this milestone anniversary. Now is a great time to celebrate our rich history, and to be proud of the work we have done and will continue to do to strengthen our community.

STAY SAFE DURING A POWER OUTAGE

Power customers in the U.S. experience an average of eight hours of power outages each year. Winter storms, severe weather, and flooding often cause isolated outages that can last days or even weeks. Here are some tips to help you prepare for a power outage.

Stay Powered

- Create an inventory of the items you need that rely on electricity.
- Have enough batteries or alternative power sources to meet your needs when the power goes out.
- Have enough flashlights (and batteries) for every member of the household.
- Determine whether your home phone will work in a power outage and how long its battery backup will last.

Know Your Medical Needs

- Talk to your medical provider about a power outage plan.
 - Have enough alternative power sources to support medical equipment that requires electricity.
 - Find out how long your medications can be safely stored at higher or lower temperatures.

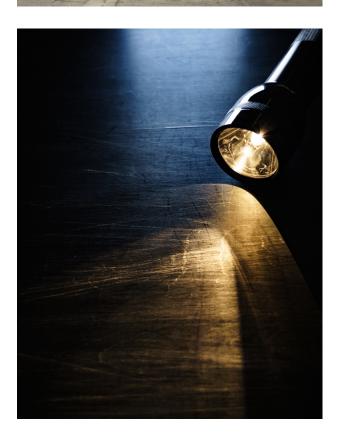
Food Storage

- Have plenty of nonperishable food and water on hand.
- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed.
 - A refrigerator will keep food cold for about four hours.
 - A full freezer will keep its temperature for about 48 hours.

Using Appliances During Power Outages

- To avoid carbon monoxide poisoning, generators, camp stoves, or charcoal grills should always be used outdoors and at least 20 feet away from windows.
- Install carbon monoxide detectors with battery backups in central locations on every level of your home.
- Never use a gas stovetop or oven to heat your home.
- Turn off or disconnect appliances, equipment, or electronics.
 Power may return with momentary surges or spikes that can damage equipment.





VITA HELPING AREA TAXPAYERS

Goodwill VITA continues to help area taxpayers. A man facing a difficult financial situation contacted the VITA office last month. An ongoing health issue prevents the man from working. And with no insurance or Medicare coverage, his financial options were limited. Goodwill's VITA team filed the man's tax returns, helped him capture his missed stimulus payments, and then helped him set up a Bank On certified bank account! Our friends at Tulsa Responds stepped in to help the man sign up for Medicare and SNAP. The taxpayer is tremendously grateful, and we are proud to have helped.

VITA can also make a difference for you, your family, and your friends. Our Summer VITA program runs through September with both online and in-person services.

Virtual services are provided in partnership with Get Your Refund. Anyone can use this free online service. Get started at GetYourRefund.org/GWT.

In-person appointments will be available on select days in Tulsa. Grab one of these appointments at GetYourRefundTulsa.org.

To use these services, you'll need your photo ID, Social Security cards for yourself and anyone else on the return, and all your tax documents (including any letters from the IRS, Oklahoma Tax Commission, or Missouri Department of Revenue). You'll also need a copy of your previously filed return if you think it contains an error. You'll find more tax-filing information on our website at GoodwillTulsa.org/FreeTaxPrep.

CITY OF TULSA OFFERING CITATION AMNESTY

The Tulsa Municipal Court is providing two amnesty sessions for citizens who have outstanding citations for parking and traffic violations.

Parking Amnesty: June 6 - June 10, 2022

During the parking amnesty period, a vehicle owner or driver will be allowed to pay the preset parking fine at Tulsa City Hall or Tulsa Municipal Court without late fees or warrant fees.

Moving Violation Amnesty: June 13 - June 17, 2022

The second amnesty session will be limited to traffic and non-parking violations. During this amnesty period, individuals will be allowed to pay their citations in full without any late fees or warrant fees.

Those unable to pay their fines in full will be able to request a meeting with a judge to set up a payment plan.

FINANCIAL EMPOWERMENT CENTER UPDATE

The FEC has now served 326 clients, including 47 new clients in May. Our counselors had 102 sessions last month, the highest monthly total to date. Sixty percent of clients have had two or more sessions.

Our dedicated counselors—Eva, Lian, and Kenny—have done great work for our clients. So, do you need to improve your credit score? Save for a big purchase? Or need some guidance on paying down debt? The counselors are here for you! FEC services are available at no cost to all Tulsans. Counseling is one-on-one and confidential. We can make appointments that fit your work schedule. You can reach a counselor at 918-802-7279.

The FEC is a couple of months into our eviction prevention pilot program with Restore Hope and the Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund. The pilot program's goals are to integrate financial counseling within an eviction prevention/rental assistance program (Restore Hope) and demonstrate how that counseling can help stabilize a tenant's finances to avoid a future housing crisis. Twelve clients are already active and having sessions.

Our partner reach also continues to expand as the FEC has begun working with organizations including the UMA Center of Tulsa and Growing Greenwood.





BANK ON TULSA CONTINUING TO EXPAND

A bank account is an important part of being financially resilient. That's why we work to connect unbanked and underbanked Tulsans to safe and affordable accounts. Bank On Tulsa is currently developing integrations with area organizations to give them the information needed to assist their clients with opening bank accounts. An example of this is our successful integration with Goodwill VITA. VITA tax preparers can now help unbanked clients open a Bank On account. This allows the client to get their tax return deposited directly into a bank account, which is significantly safer and faster than getting a return check through the mail.

Bank On Tulsa has certified eight bank accounts in the Tulsa area. These accounts are safe, affordable, and fully functional.
