Late last week we received notification that our TAUW panel approved a 2023 allocation to Goodwill of \$601,351 contingent upon TAUW hitting their fundraising goal for this year of \$25,913,704. Goodwill's internal fundraising campaign will go towards helping to achieve that goal, so I wanted to give you more details about TAUW in preparation for next month.



Goodwill is one of 59 nonprofit agencies currently receiving funding from TAUW. These agencies cover a wide spectrum of important services that make our community a better

place to live and work. I personally like the idea of knowing that I can support 59 different agencies simply by dedicating a portion of my salary each pay period to supporting TAUW. As far as Goodwill is concerned, funds that we receive from TAUW support Center-Based Services for Individuals with Disabilities (Helms Center), Goodwill's TulsaWORKS Career Academy, and our Financial Stability programs (VITA/FEC/Bank On). ## TULSA FEC RIDING MOMENTUM INTO YEAR TWO



In August, the Tulsa FEC closed out year one of our two-year contract with the Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund. September looks to be a busy month, helping us build off the summer's momentum.

We ended the first year with 133 outcomes and 1,225 sessions. Our goals are even higher for the FEC's second year! For year two, we need to earn 300 outcomes and hold 2.400 sessions.

Reminder: Outcomes are what the FEC uses to track changes in a client's status regarding their banking, credit, debt, or savings. They are tangible results that show how a client is progressing towards their financial goals. Outcomes demonstrate the client's work and effort. Outcomes, and the achievements associated with them, also allow us to monitor the FEC's performance – counselors, staff, and partners.





Since we launched in December 2020, our counselors have guided 43 Tulsans to reduce the number of their delinquent accounts, cutting \$145,000 in debts, increasing credit scores by 35 points, and building up \$63,000 in savings. In year one, some clients were able to avoid evictions while others found their way out from under massive medical debt. Clients stopped receiving harassing calls from collectors or learned why they spend their money the way they do.

Thank you, FEC counselors, for all you have done to see the program through its first year. You started on this journey at the height of a pandemic. You endured program changes and office moves while juggling sessions at multiple locations. It has not gone unnoticed. Although we didn't reach all our goals, you made a difference in more than 400 people's lives. Congratulations!

To keep getting the word out, we plan to do another re-launch campaign coinciding with the beginning of year two. You can help spread the news about the FEC: drop off a flier, share the website, or direct someone to our <u>Award Winners videos on YouTube</u>. FEC services are available to all Tulsa residents at no cost.

#### JOB CONNECTION INSTALLS DIGITAL DISPLAY

Goodwill Job Connection continues to grow its efforts to connect job seekers with Tulsa-area jobs. Employers in the Tulsa area utilize the Job Connection to post and disseminate new openings.

New this year, Job Connection's 17th & Yale office now has a large monitor that displays open jobs and hiring events to the public.

The Job Connection staff also offers resume assistance, career exploration, and job leads to anyone seeking help with their career.



## TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE LOAN FORGIVENESS WAIVER BY OCTOBER 31

From Federal Student Aid (An office of the U.S. Department of Education)

Until October 31, 2022, federal student loan borrowers can get credit for payments that previously didn't qualify for Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) or Temporary Expanded Public Service Loan Forgiveness (TEPSLF).

Under the limited PSLF waiver, you can get credit for past payments even if you:

- had or have a Federal Family Education Program (FFEL) loan or Perkins loan
- didn't make the payment on time,
- didn't pay the full amount due, or
- weren't on the right repayment plan.





## BREAKING NEWS: OKLAHOMA NATURAL GAS ADDING MONTHLY CHARGE



The Oklahoma Corporation Commission ("OCC") has recently approved a securitization mechanism that was developed to allow the collection of the extraordinary costs from the 2021 winter storm over several years, thereby lessening the impact on customers' bills.

How will this impact your bill? The average residential customer will see a monthly charge between just over \$6 to \$10 a month, depending on their annual natural gas usage. Low-income customers will pay \$0. This charge will appear as a "Winter Event Cost Recovery" line item on your bill beginning August 30, 2022.
