BIG GROWTH & CHANGES COMING TO GOODWILL

I am excited to share major changes coming to Goodwill as we head into the holidays and beyond. We are retooling and renaming our job placement services, expanding our footprint into a new city in Oklahoma, and preparing to open a new location in Tulsa.

If you've been by our offices at 17th and Yale recently, you may have noticed some changes to the former Goodwill Job Connection. That's because we are updating the services we offer to job seekers and relaunching the program under a new name: Goodwill Career Center. The Career Center will go beyond the job search and help individuals develop a career plan so that they can grow in their professional lives.

I am also excited to announce that Goodwill Tulsa will expand its services into a new city in 2024. Muskogee will be the home of a new retail store, attended donation center, and a second Goodwill Career Center. This means we will bring our mission to provide work opportunities, job training, and support services for people with disabilities or other employment barriers to a new community.



Here in Tulsa, we will open a new attended donation center this winter. The new donation center will open at 101st and Mingo, a part of South Tulsa that has long been underserved. We will be growing our donations staff to help man this new location.

These changes are possible only because of the continued support we receive from our community, including from partners like the Tulsa Area United Way. I believe that being a good partner goes both ways, and that's why I am pleased to see that so many of Goodwill's employees participated in this year's United Way campaign. I want to thank every one of you who decided to give to the United Way. Your gifts help the United Way continue to grow to the benefit of the entire Tulsa area.
