I am extremely pleased to say that I have great confidence that we can reach our \$45,000 goal prior to the deadline to report our fundraising goal to the United Way.

I want to close this month by highlighting a couple of programs for you. The first one is our VITA program. Deadlines for filing 2020 tax returns were extended multiple times and as a result, we just wrapped up our VITA campaign. I want to congratulate Karla Davis and Modi Kwanza for the persistence and flexibility they have shown this year in dealing with multiple changes from the IRS during this tax season. The second one is our Donated Goods Program. It is well known that we have struggled with a shortage of staff in all areas of donated goods this year, but it has not deterred us from achieving some amazing results. In October we had the highest single month of store sales that we have ever had in our history - just over \$1.7 million! This is a testament to the work that everyone throughout the Donated Goods Program is doing to collect, transport, process and sell donated goods. I want to thank and congratulate all of you for the hard work you have put in to achieve these results.

Thanksgiving Holiday Safety


Thanksgiving is a wonderful time to gather with friends and family, eat delicious food, watch football (or the parade!), and travel to visit loved ones. While enjoying the holiday, and as things might get hectic, it is important to always keep safety in mind.

Top safety hazards during the Thanksgiving holiday include:

- FIRE ... kitchen fires, candles and outdoor deep fryers
- FOOD ... choking and poisoning, cuts and burns during food preparation
- TRAVEL ... car accidents, driving while intoxicated or distracted

KITCHEN SAFETY

- Keep children away from the stove.
- Do not leave the house while the turkey is cooking.
- Ensure the kitchen floor is kept clear and doesn't have any trip hazards.



Kitchen safety is even more important than usual during busy holiday times, like Thanksgiving, when more people might be working in the kitchen to prepare a large meal. But for casual cooks and experienced chefs alike, the kitchen presents more hazards than imagined.

HOLIDAY FIRE PREVENTION TIPS

\$15 million in property damage every year.

- Keep baking soda on hand to put out kitchen fires.
- Do not leave food cooking or the stove unsupervised.
- Make sure smoke alarms are working.
- A household fire extinguisher should always be nearby.
- Do not leave candles burning unattended and do not burn candles near flammable items like curtains or potpourri.
- Follow all instructions carefully when using a deep fryer and monitor closely!

Incidents of choking and food poisoning increase during the holidays, especially around Thanksgiving, as people are preparing and consuming more food than usual. Food Safety News reports that approximately 51 million turkeys are consumed on Thanksgiving.

FOOD SAFETY

- Always wash your hands after handling raw or under-cooked poultry.
- Use separate cutting boards for raw meat and produce to prevent cross-contamination.
- The USDA recommends cooking the turkey at a minimum of 325 degrees. Use a food thermometer and cook the turkey to an internal temperature of 165 to 180 degrees to ensure the turkey is cooked thoroughly and to avoid illness caused by consuming under-cooked poultry.
- Store leftovers within 2 hours or toss them.

PET SAFETY

The Veterinary Medical Association warns that turkey and chicken bones should never be given to pets because they can splinter and pets may choke.

Dogs should be kept away from any dish that has onions, leeks, garlic, raisins, grapes or chocolate, as those foods can be hazardous to your dog's health.

HOLIDAY TRAVEL SAFETY

With Thanksgiving being one of the most travel-heavy times of the year, it is important to be prepared before hitting the road and to drive defensively, especially during bad weather.

Drivers who are texting take their eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. Driving at 55 mph, that is about the length of a football field.

- Buckle up, every trip.
- Make sure your vehicle is well maintained.
- Plan your route ahead of time.
- Carry an emergency kit in the car.
- Be aware of weather conditions.
- Take caution in parking lots while out shopping.
- No texting while driving.



According to the National Highway Safety Association, more than 40% of holiday car accidents involve alcohol. **DO NOT DRINK AND DRIVE.**

Take a breather and remind yourself what the holidays are truly about and know that nothing is more important than having a safe holiday this year.



With it nearing the end of 2021, now is a great time to review your own bank account and encourage the clients you work with to review theirs as well. Many people are not aware of the fees they are being charged, and how they could possibly be paying less for the same type of account, or possibly an even better account. The six financial institutions offering Bank

On approved accounts here in Tulsa are Arvest Bank, BancFirst, Bank of America, Chase, Discover Bank, and Simmons Bank. Here is a list of common fees charged at financial institutions, and how the national average differs from Bank On Certified Accounts.

VITA roundup ...

We have closed tax preparation for the 2020 tax season. The final results (drum roll):



To date, the VITA team has helped at least 276 taxpayers claim just over \$200K in Child Tax Credit. Taxpayers can still sign up for the advanced child tax credit payments or update their information to receive the payments using the online tool at GetYourCTC.org/Tulsa.

At the Tulsa FEC



In October, we reached another milestone as we began serving our 150th client last month.

The FEC financial counselors have held 466 sessions, resulting in 48 outcomes for 18 clients.

In partnership news, the Tulsa Day Center has begun making referrals to the FEC. And TEDC, which supports small businesses, will refer local entrepreneurs who might benefit from financial counseling.

As the FEC approaches its one-year anniversary, we're ramping up our efforts to familiarize the community with the service. For example, there are ads on city busses and benches around the city.
